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KITCHEN – PINK ALERT

Hour	Item	Action	Comment/ Sign
Immediate	Meet with Care Manager at heads of dept	 Highlight in the kitchen area the affected residents and ensure the following: All meals to be served on plastic crockery and disposable cutlery and serviettes Kitchen staff do not enter the Covid affected residents' rooms. Deliver the food to the corridor and the care staff will take it to the resident Bottled water is given to the RN/Care staff to take to the rooms of affected residents Meals are prepared and serviced on disposable plates with disposable cutlery and paper napkins. Salt and pepper is delivered in disposable sachets Thickened fluids are given via disposable pre-bought drinks- see RN Food is taken of the tray and placed on tables in the outbreak zone so trays are not given to residents. On leaving the outbreak zone spray the castors and trolley with aerosol disinfectant Before trays are returned to the kitchen for washing again spray trays and trolley with aerosol disinfectant 	
Ongoing	Affected Residents	 Highlight in the kitchen area the affected residents and ensure the following: Kitchen staff do not enter the rooms of affected residents Bottled water is given to the RN/Care staff to take to the rooms of affected residents Meals are prepared and serviced on disposable plates with disposable cutlery and paper napkins. Salt and pepper is delivered in disposable sachets Thickened fluids are given via disposable pre-bought drinks- see RN 	
Ongoing	Documentation	Kitchen to document and maintain a register of who has received a meal on a disposable plate etc Who has been given bottled water and how many, etc	
	Meals for others	All visitor and staff meals will be stopped during an outbreak Only Resident meals will be prepared
